

Sgt. Hile Expects Army Discharge

Technical Sergeant Allen Hile, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Hile, of Wolverton street, is home on a 30-day furlough from the China-India-Burma war theatre. He has acquired 128 points and expects an early discharge. He will report to Camp Totten, S. C. at the conclusion of his furlough. He is one of the five Hile brothers in the service.

He left last March for the CIB front after spending a furlough here with his parents and his wife, the former Evelyn Guyer, at her home, Lenker avenue. On Tuesday a daughter was born to Sgt. and Mrs. Hile. Mother and child are getting along fine.

Sgt. Hile, who is in the Air Corps was in the European theatre of Operations before going to the Far East. He made 64 missions in Europe, wears the Air Medal with numerous Oak Leaf clusters, and the Presidential citation with three clusters as well as the Good Conduct Medal. He was also decorated by the French with Croix de Guerre. He was formerly in Sardinia and was then sent back to this country and then to the Far East. He made nine trips over the famous "Hump" from India to China and was with the 12th Air Corps.
